

**Brookville, Indiana**  
(Meetings began 1978 or 1979)

For several years, AA meetings met in local churches, but they had no regular home. But, on September 8<sup>th</sup>, 1979, the Brookville AAs celebrated the opening day of a new club called “The Easy Does It Center.” This was in the basement of the old courthouse annex on the corner of 5<sup>th</sup> & Main Street. The entrance was on 5<sup>th</sup> Street. There is a list of about forty-five who were in attendance. Among the movers and shakers of this new club were Paul Martin, Chris Martin and Gerald Barber.

The meetings were well attended and AAs came from Connersville, Richmond and from many surrounding communities. They had regular ‘eating meetings,’ and the attendees would often enjoy this good fellowship till late hours.

But sadly, in 1996, this great location became unavailable and the club moved to a much smaller location at 416 Court Street, near downtown. Then on November 27<sup>th</sup>, 1998, the club moved to a much nicer building the Senior Citizens Center, 151 East 4<sup>th</sup> Street. The first meeting took place the next day.

The “Easy Does It Club” now has meetings every Saturday and Monday evening. A new Al-Anon meeting meets concurrently with the Saturday evening group. It started October 12, 2008.
